WHAT TO EXPECT IN MALAYSIA?



KUALA LUMPUR CITY CENTRE (KLCC)

Located in the KL city centre, the Petronas Twin Towers' architecture is Islamic-inspired and the buildings primarily house the corporate headquarters of the Petronas Company and other offices. Petronas Twin Towers has two identical 88-storey buildings, joined at the 41st and 42nd floors (175m above street level) by a 58.4 metre-long, double-decker Skybridge.



BATU CAVES

Batu Caves is a limestone hill comprising three major caves and a number of smaller ones. This 100-year-old temple features idols and statues erected inside and around the main caves and is frequented by visitors from all over the world throughout the year. Incorporated with interior limestone formations said to be around 400 million years old, the temple is considered an important religious landmark by Hindus.



CENTRAL MARKET

Built in 1928, the Central Market, also known as Pasar Seni is just a short walk away from Petaling Street, along Jalan Hang Kasturi. The focus for the city's artistic community, inside the building is a warren of boutiques, handicraft, and souvenir stalls with traders selling local merchandise such as authentic Malaysian batik prints and more.



SULTAN ABDUL SAMAD BUILDING

Constructed entirely of brick, the Sultan Abdul Samad building features strong Gothic, Western and Moorish-style influences with an imposing porch, graceful arches, curved colonnades topped with shiny copper cupolas, and a domineering 41.2m-high clock tower. It is frequently seen as the backdrop for Malaysia's annual Independence Day parades, which take place at Dataran Merdeka.

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

APPLICABLE FOR STUDENTS FROM OUR PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

The language of instruction at Taylor's University is English. Each semester consists of 14 teaching weeks and is approximately 18 weeks, including final examination. Each module (also known as subject or course) typically offers 4 credits. Each credit is equivalent to 1.5 ECTS and represents 1 hour of weekly contact time. Students are required to take a minimum of 16 credits (equivalent to 24 ECTS) and may enroll in a maximum of 20 credits (30 ECTS) per semester.

Students may choose modules from a wide range of undergraduate programmes offered by our Faculty of Business and Law, Faculty of Innovation and Technology, Faculty of Social Sciences and Leisure Management, and Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences for their student exchange programme at Taylor's University.

DURATION OF STUDY

Students can spend one or two semester(s) at Taylor's University on tuition fees waiver basis.

Upon successful completion of the modules at Taylor's University, students are able to receive credits which could be credited towards the student's award programme at their home institution. Credits for the study are awarded wholly at the discretion of the home institution.

1 SEMESTER STUDY + 1 SEMESTER INTERNSHIP

At Taylor's University, students have the option to extend their exchange period by participating in an internship, which they must indicate their interest during the student exchange application process. Upon approval, exchange students may proceed to start their internship at an organisation of their choice in Malaysia and may even be given allowance by the host company (subject to the individual company's policy).

It is compulsory for exchange students to participate in our internship-related workshops before undertaking their internships. This ensures they acquire the necessary skills for better preparation and a more fulfilling internship experience.

STUDENT EXCHANGE APPLICATION

Requirements

- Students must have completed at least one year of full-time study at undergraduate level with CGPA of 2.5 or above.
- English Language proficiency of minimum IELTS 5.5, TOEFL IBT 46, or equivalent. Some programmes may have higher English language requirements, as required from time to time.
- Student's home institution must be a Student Exchange Partner of Taylor's University.

COSTS

Under our reciprocal student exchange agreements with our partner universities, exchange students pay tuition fees to their home institutions. While embracing this exceptional opportunity, students will need to purchase the Medical Healthcare and Travel Insurance and cover their own expenses such as accommodation, travels, meals, visa, and other living expenses.

LIVING EXPENSES

The cost of living in Malaysia is relatively economical. An estimated average monthly expenditure of a student is shown below:

DURATION OF STUDY

Our Edutourism/Summer Programmes are conducted in English and are normally offered for a duration of 2 to 4 weeks in August/September.

BENEFITS

Students who participate in our Edutourism/Summer Programmes gain a myriad of benefits. These include increased self-confidence, independent thinking and leadership skills through the development of cross-cultural understanding, acceptance of diversity, and gain ability to be flexible and adapt to new situations. International exposure complements and enhances the learning experience of students, which may not be possible with the conventional methods of learning confined to the home institution.

PAYMENT OF FEES

The programme fee is estimated at USD1,800 (subject to change without prior notice) and cover accommodation, experiential learning, welcome and farewell receptions, and cultural tours. Flight tickets, travel and health insurance, Social Visit Pass (SVP), airport transfer, and living expenses are to be borne by the students.

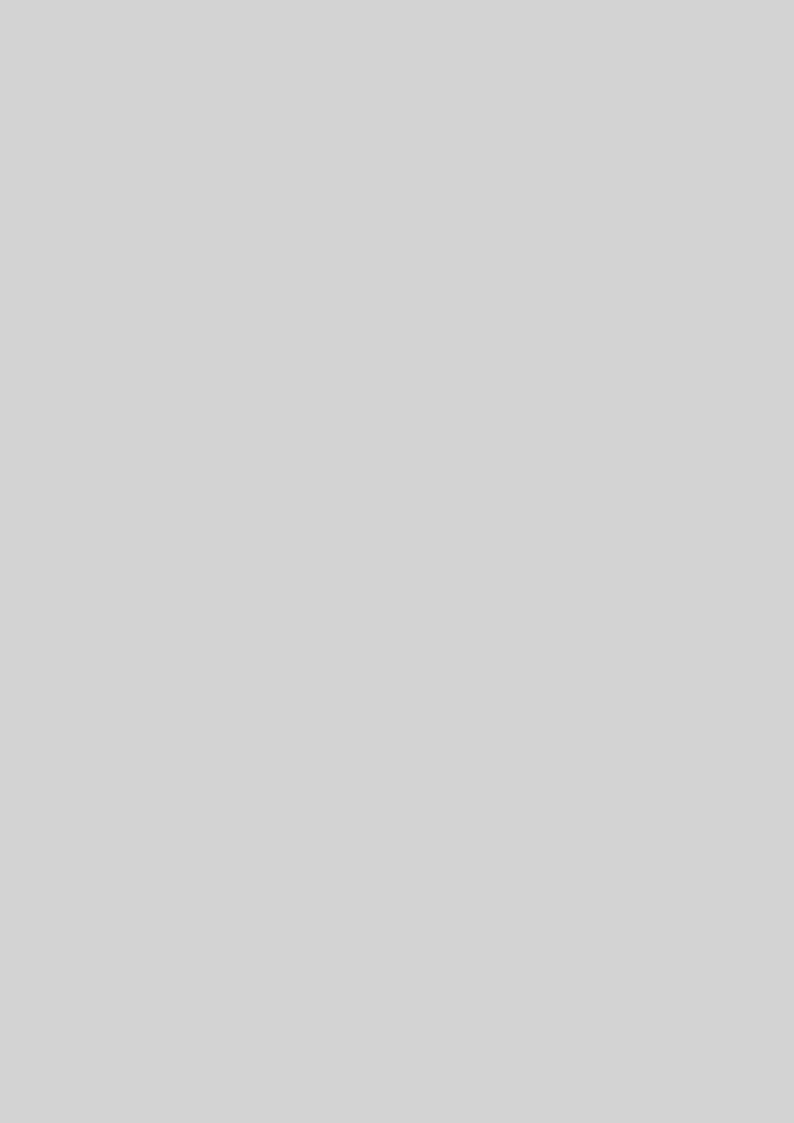


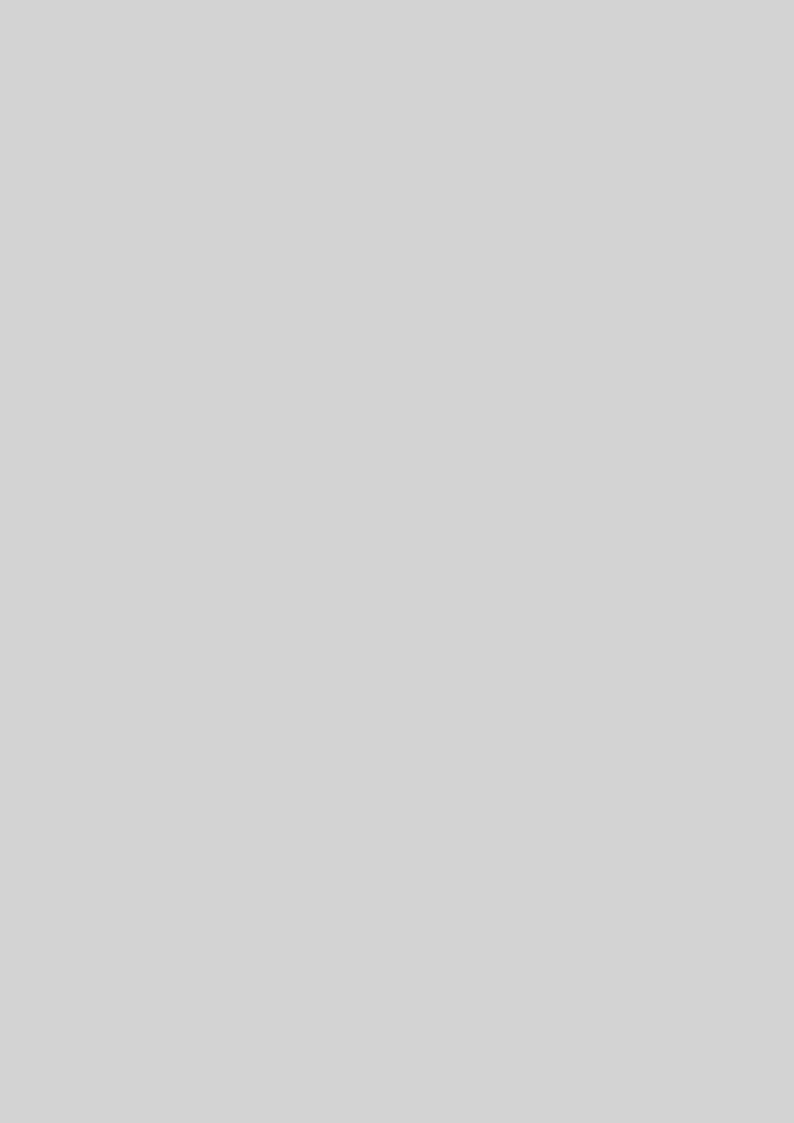




SUPPORT SERVICES
